Kohler High School is part of Kohler Public Schools, a JK-12 district serving approximately 745 students. Total high school enrollment has averaged 200 students over the past 5 years.

The Village of Kohler is located 60 miles north of Milwaukee in Sheboygan County, Wisconsin. Kohler’s population is 2,235 nestled in a community of approximately 116,000 residents and is home to farming and manufacturing businesses.

The global headquarters and main factories of Kohler Company, most well known for their plumbing manufacturing, are based in Kohler, Wisconsin. Kohler is home to The American Club, a five-diamond resort, as well as four Championship top 100 golf courses including Whistling Straits Golf course, host of the 2020 Ryder Cup.

Since 1924, Kohler High School has been graduating students who are well prepared for college, employment and life beyond our school through arts, academics, and extracurricular activities. The result is a school experience marked by considerable academic and personal growth due to our focus on the individual and building connections that span generations.

Kohler High School offers some unique advantages. In addition to its strong college preparatory curriculum and small class sizes, the high school continues to offer courses in traditional disciplines such as woodworking and metals. Our students have ample and intentional access to job shadows, work experiences, and internships through the many business opportunities available in our surrounding community.

Our Village Community continues to demonstrate their value of education through a recently completed \$21 million school improvement referendum which included the expansion of our physical footprint, creation of a new library, and upgrades to facilities. Kohler High School improvements included creation of flexible learning environments, and substantial expansion of multi-media collaboration spaces to promote Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math hands-on learning opportunities. The project also expanded and improved our Athletic and Recreational Facilities which are embraced in our school community represented by high rates of participation.

**Class Rank**

**GPA**

Kohler High School utilizes an unweighted and weighted GPA scale. Both are reflected on the student’s transcript.  
All grades for attempted courses are used in the computation of the grade point average.

**Block Scheduling**

Kohler High School utilizes a block schedule. Each day has four 85-minute class blocks.

**AP/Honors Courses** are given a grade weight; courses are to be weighted by an additional .33 for each honors course and an additional .66 for each AP course. Students are not required to take the AP exam.

**Dual Enrollment Programming**

Kohler High School offers four dual enrollment options within the classroom setting. These courses are integrated with the AP/Honors curriculum and are taught in the same classroom environment. Students enrolled in dual enrollment classes learn alongside their peers in the AP/Honors track, choosing their preferred pathway—either AP/Honors or dual enrollment—within the same course.

The courses included in this program are:

- **First Year Writing** (Dual Enrollment) and **AP Language and Composition**
- **Introduction to Literature** (Dual Enrollment) and **AP Literature and Composition**
- **Precalculus** (Dual Enrollment) and **Honors Precalculus**
- **Calculus and Analytic Geometry** (Dual Enrollment) and **AP Calculus AB**
